<b>Description:</b>	Improves the quality of health promotion and preventive services for all children and their families through the national implementation of the Bright Futures Guidelines for Health Supervision of Infants, Children and Adolescents. The goals of Bright Futures are to: 1) promote desired social, developmental, and health outcomes of infants, children, and adolescents; 2) enhance health care professionals' knowledge, skills, and practice of developmentally appropriate health care, emphasizing health promotion and prevention, in the context of family and community; 3) increase family knowledge, skills, and participation in health-promoting and prevention activities; and 4) foster partnerships between families, health professionals, public health and the broader community to promote children's health.
